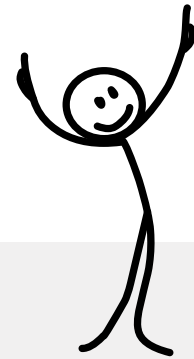


Happy Easter to all our families, and welcome back. This is our final term, term 3.

Therefore, "speak" great things, "speak" positive things both in your head and out loud. Andrew shared his dream of one day coaching Trinidad & Tobago's Olympic Sailing Team. He asked each student to write a dream down and believe they can accomplish it. One student commented that this talk came at an opportune time as it encouraged him not to give up on one of his dreams, which he had recently decided to let go of.
