

From the Character Education Department...

Dear Parents, Teachers and students,

This month we are focusing on a virtue that can be understood in deeper and deeper ways as we get older. In order to ensure that our children are deeply rooted in a strong sense of justice we should all be mindful of how we foster this virtue from a young age. Hopefully this document can be a useful prompt for discussing the virtue of justice with our children.

Justice consists in giving each person their due. In simpler terms, it means being fair. It is an important virtue because it regulates how we deal with other people; family, friends, schoolmates, and our wider community.

Humans have a natural inclination to justice which begins to unfold from a very young age. Even small children understand when a toy is rightfully theirs, but it takes a while longer for them to recognise when injustices are done to others and what makes an action just or unjust.

Some examples we can give are as follows - The just person acts in the following ways:

- · They respect others opinions
- · They don't gossip about others weaknesses
- · They tell the truth
- They know how to keep a secret and how to keep their word.
- They respect others' property and look after and return what they borrow
- They respect the rules of a game
- · They are able to forgive and do not seek revenge
- They are able to repair and make-up for their wrong doings
- · They treat others as they would like to be treated

As we grow older, we must develop a more elaborate concept of justice in recognition of the innate dignity of each individual. True justice doesn't mean treating everyone exactly the same, but rather using our wisdom to treat each person fairly, taking into account each person's different characteristics, abilities and circumstances. In this sense, charity and justice are intertwined. As Christians, we are called to be motivated by love (charity) and not simply justice. In the words of Gottfried Leibniz, "Justice is charity in accordance with wisdom".

Justice means not only giving others their due, but also giving God his due for the gift of life He has given us. Furthermore, because of our God-given human dignity, it is not just charity but justice that calls us to attend to the needs of others. Nelson Mandela famously said, "Overcoming poverty is not a gesture of charity. It is an act of justice."

The bonds of justice also help us to be more refined in in the way we live charity. For example, it's no good if we spend all our time and money doing good for others in our community if we aren't first doing good for our own families. This would not be in accordance with the virtue of justice. Equally, if all our time and energy is focused on our own family and friends and we ignore the needs of others in wider society, this is also not living justice. **True charity goes beyond justice...but it never lacks justice.**

Let's have a wonderful month contemplating and living this wonderful virtue in all its forms!
